Hurray for November! As much as I enjoy Advent and Christmas, I must admit my all-time favorite holiday is Thanksgiving Day. As we enter the month of November, I am already looking forward to Thanksgiving. It is the perfect day to take stock of all our blessings. And even though we are making our way through the second year of the Covid-19 pandemic, there is still so much to be grateful for.

Recently I came across a website I want to share with you. The website is *gratefulness.org: A Network of Grateful Living*. The organization, *A Network of Grateful Living*, was founded in 2000 by Brother David Steindl-Rast, OSB, known as the "grandfather of gratitude" and one of the most important figures in the modern interfaith dialogue movement.

On the *gratefulness.org* website, there is a definition for the word gratitude I found helpful. In her book, *Living in Gratitude: A Journey That Will Change Your Life*, Angeles Arrien defines gratitude this way: "Gratitude is a feeling that spontaneously emerges from within. However, it is not simply an emotional response; it is also a choice we make. We can choose to be grateful, or we can choose to be ungrateful—to take our gifts and blessings for granted. As a choice, gratitude is an attitude or disposition."

So, what would it be like if we were to choose gratefulness, not just on Thanksgiving Day this year, but on every day during the month of November? What if every morning we were to wake up grateful? What if gratefulness became our attitude?

According to the Old Farmer's Almanac, the full moon in November is called the Full Beaver Moon because this is the time of year when beavers begin to take shelter in their lodges, having laid up sufficient stores of food for the long winter ahead. At the time of the fur trade in North America, it was also the season to trap beavers for their thick, winter-ready pelts.

Come and join us on this special evening and walk the *Labyrinth* in the Field by candlelight. It is a wonderful way to walk in quiet mediation while enjoying the evening in the beauty and wonder of God's amazing creation.


