Welcome to September! This is the month we celebrate Labor Day, go apple picking, swat away annoying yellow jackets, begin wearing shoes again, acknowledge the arrival of the Autumn Equinox, and feel crisp cool breezes blowing on our faces as the light of day gives way to earlier evenings.

There are two other things that are also worthy of our attention this September. The first is the new school year which begins for many children after Labor Day. The second is the celebration of the Feast of Michael and all Angels on Sunday, September 25th, during the Celtic Prayer Service.

As many of you know, the beginning of a new school year can be an exciting time as well as a stress-filled one for students, parents, and teachers. There is a lot to prepare for at the beginning of every new school year for all involved. After the challenges faced by schools during the past several years due to the pandemic, it seems a perfect time to pray for a joy-filled and smooth opening of school along with a happy and healthy academic year.

So, this year I invite you to pray for all children (young and old) heading back to school, along with their parent(s) and teachers. Below you'll find three prayers to help you with this challenge. My hope is they will inspire you to find words for your own to pray and perhaps even remind you of your school days and the significance of their influence on your life.

The second happening is the celebration of the Feast of Michael and all angels, traditionally known as Michaelmas. During our Celtic Prayer Service on September 25th, we'll learn more about this Christian feast while eating berries during breakfast that begins at 8:30 am Since the 5th century, the day has been associated with the end of harvest, the beginning of autumn, and the shortening of days. One story told is that before the end of the day, blackberries must be picked and eaten, because it is believed that on that day, the Archangel Michael drove the devil out of heaven, and landed in a blackberry bush, which he spat on and cursed.

Beloved people, enjoy September and if you get a chance, bake some apple crisp, apple bread, or cook some applesauce and share it with a family member or friend you haven't seen or talked with since the beginning of the summer. Remind them this month how much you love and care for them. And, as the Apostle Paul reminds us, "Rejoice in hope, be patient in tribulation, be constant in prayer." (Romans 12:12 ESV)


A Prayer for Parents
