Annual Meeting Minutes * Sunday, February 11, 2024

Eleven members and two guests were present for the 10:45 a.m. meeting. Joanne O'Connor was voted in to act as Moderator.

The minutes from the January 2023 annual meeting were accepted.

Treasurer's Report was accepted as printed in the annual report. It was mentioned that the amount to be spent on a minister is still up in the air as we are still in search mode.

The budget was also accepted as presented. A tentative minister's salary is presented. 4% of the endowment is being used this year which will allow the principle to grow. When we do hire a full-time minister more will be drawn from endowment to pay that salary.

Trustees report passed. Thrift Store had a great year, thanks for Sue Sikes and team; and a thank you sent out to George Malone for all his help throughout the year reading on Sundays and mowing in the summer months.

Nominations accepted with the addition of Marie Cooper as Deacon whose name was inadvertently removed from the list. Gail Boudin will act as a substitute for the deacons.

Search Committee report passed. The Church profile is in the process of being updated with very helpful guidance from Rev. Dr. Janet Peck.

Other Business:

- 1. The church received a letter from Rev. Dr. Malcolm Himshoot, Dean of the Maine School of Ministry. He has offered to send speakers, perhaps pulpit supply worship leaders, and asked for a donation. Members present agreed that a speaker would be greatly appreciated and would aid in furthering our efforts in finding a new minister. Madeline Olney will set up a time for a speaker to come in March or April when we can then send in a donation.
- 2. Habitat 7 Rivers has asked our church to join in covenant with them. A speaker will be here in two weeks to explain their organization's efforts and inform the members on how they can get involved. We will later vote on joining their efforts.
- 3. Joe Cough of Waldoboro has applied to become our church pianist. Marjorie met with him the other day and he will be playing for us next week. If all goes well, he will be hired at a \$150 weekly fee. He holds a Master of Music Degree in Vocal Performance, plays piano and guitar; and he also has knowledge of sound equipment which will be most beneficial. Members were very excited about this news. Katie McShane and Jesse Healsy, our present part-time musicians, are interested in filling in come Fall. Having live music will also be a good recruitment tool for attracting new members. Meeting adjourned at 11:20 p.m.


Sunday Services


