We have hired a new pastor!

The Edgecomb Community Church members voted unanimously Sunday, June 23, to accept Aram Mitchell of Cambridge, MA to become their new pastor. Aram will begin his tenure on September 23, 2024. He will preach twice a month for a year, at which time a more permanent status may evolve.

Mitchell received his bachelor's degree in religious studies at Houghton College (Summa Cum Laude), and his Master of Arts in Religious Studies at Chicago Theological Seminary.

Mitchell is a facilitator, retreat leader, coach, teacher, wilderness guide, and minister with experience working for nonprofit organizations, educational institutions, and communities of spiritual practice. He has helped to direct several nonprofit organizations in delivering services that contribute to the formation and well-being of justice-oriented community leaders.

Aram has designed programs, led workshops, and taught continuing education courses about wilderness spirituality, climate change, vocational burnout, compassion fatigue, ecological grief, self-care, nature connection, theology, poetry, feminism, and mature masculinity. And he has supported hundreds of people in the process of becoming more true to themselves, more faithful to the earth, and more confident in their capacity to sustain good work for the long-haul.

Mitchell's past and present working titles include CEU Instructor for the School of Global Citizenry, Wilderness Guide and Facilitator, Eco-mini-stry Guide for Center for Wild Spirituality, Director of Partnerships & Formation for the BTS Center, Faculty Advisor for the Chaplaincy Institute of Maine, Executive Director of Renewal in the Wilderness, and Congregational Minister for Children for Clairmont CUCC in California.

Mitchell is also a licensed Wilderness First Responder through Wilderness Medical Associates International, a Registered Maine Guide for the State of Maine, and a CEU Certified Instructor through Tumbah Global.

Please come and listen to Pastor Aram this fall; he is such an awe-inspiring speaker. He has filled in recently as a pulpit supply leader; check him out on our YouTube site using the link printed at left of this page.

The Search Committee is very excited to have Aram and his wife-to-be (to be married this August) Emma with us at the Edgecomb CC.

Edgecomb Community Church will be holding a special Sunday worship service on July 14, to commemorate Edgecomb's 250th anniversary. The service will begin at 9:30 a.m. with the introduction of the church's newly hired pastor Aram Mitchell who will be officiating the service. Included in the service will be a reading of the original petition signed by 55 inhabitants of a plantation located in Lincoln County calling for town incorporation.

Music will be provided by pianist Joseph Cough, Jr. Familiar hymns will be sung by the congregation, and some solo/duet anthems are being planned. An offering will be collected and used for local fuel assistance.

Following the service an ice cream social will commence downstairs in fellow-ship hall. Several church members will be dressed in vintage costumes. Come and



experience an old time worship service while meeting old and new friends at a good ole ice cream social. Bring the whole family. Games for the kids will be provided outside, weather permitting. The church's labyrinth in the field out behind the building will be available for any wishing to walk it as well.






Iris Sale July 6

Patricia H. Greene beloved member and friend

Patricia (Pat) Houghton Greene died on June 7, 2024 after a brief struggle with cancer and a long struggle with bronchiectasis and other lung issues. She was born on April 12, 1941, in Fort Fairfield, Maine, the daughter of Thomas and Antoria (Rosen) Houghton.

Pat graduated from Fort Fairfield High School in 1959 and received a BS degree in home economics education from the University of Maine in 1963. She obtained an MS in child development and family relationships at the Penn State University in

1965 after which she was employed by Penn State working on a joint project with the U.S. Office of Education. The project involved developing a curriculum guide to be used in training teachers of the Head Start program. During this time Pat met George who was a grad student at Penn State, and they were married in 1966. She taught preschool classes at the Penn State Child Development Laboratory and at Menallen Friends School in Biglerville, Pennsylvania. Pat received an MEd degree in special education from Shippensburg University in 1989 and spent most of her remaining teaching career as a special education preschool teacher in Pennsylvania. Teaching was her passion and she was most comfortable around young children whom she loved dearly.

Pat was an active member of Zion United Church of Christ in Arendtsville, Pennsylvania and later a member of the Edgecomb Community Church, assisting with church suppers and volunteering her services whenever possible. Pat enjoyed cooking, gardening, sewing and knitting but her greatest pleasure came from being with family. She especially enjoyed being with her grand-daughter Grace with whom she had a very special relationship. She also had a very close relationship with her daughter Susan.

In addition to her parents, Pat was predeceased by her sister-in-law Nancy Wood and niece Amy Winston. She is survived by her loving husband of 57 years, George; daughter Susan and granddaughter Grace. She is also survived by her sister Bonnie Winston, half-sister Carolyn (Carlson) Williams, brothers Thomas ("Tim") Houghton III and John (Margaret) Houghton; nieces Timberly Sweeney and Kari Williams; nephews Bruce Houghton, Thomas Houghton IV, Ryan Houghton, Peter Wood, Timothy Wood, and Mark Williams. In addition, she is survived by several cousins. George and Pat had only one biological daughter. However, in 1974 Sharon Griest Ballen came to live with them when her dad died. Sharon became the older sister Susan never had and remains a very important part of our family. Her visits have meant a great deal to Pat.

A service was held at Edgecomb Community Church on Tuesday, June 25, at 11 a.m. with a reception in fellowship hall.

Wiscasset Homes on Tour 2024 Saturday, July 13, 11-4

Homes on Tour 2024 will feature a collection of private homes in historic Wiscasset Village and the neighboring communities of Alna, Dresden, Edgecomb, and Woolwich and will include some of the most significant and iconic buildings in the area. Our featured homes are treasured private residences, and homeowners have successfully blended contemporary taste with historical details so that glimpses of the past remain.

In the late 18th and early 19th centuries, picturesque Wiscasset had a prolific ship-building industry, now long gone, along the shores of the Sheepscot River. But those remaining emblems of wealth – the well-preserved, handsome Federal-style homes – are why Wiscasset is known as "the prettiest village in Maine."

In 2024, tickets are priced at \$30 each and are available for advance purchase online (with processing fee) or in person on the day of the tour. All tickets should be picked up at the parking lot at 36 Water St., Wiscasset, ME, 04578, from 10am to 3pm on the day of the tour, July 13. Visitor parking and bathrooms nearby.

The featured homes will all be located in or near Wiscasset Village and surrounding communities. A special feature in 2024 will be afternoon tea - with homemade sweets - in a lovely Wiscasset Village garden featuring native plants.

PICNIC LUNCH—For the convenience of tour-goers, an optional picnic lunch is available for advance order at \$18. each. Lunches are prepared by Wiscasset's Back River Bistro and selections include Romaine Salad, Kale Crunch Salad, Chicken Salad Sandwich, Muffuletta, and Cucumber Caprese Sandwich (menu descriptions online). Each order includes original flavor chips and a chocolate chip cookie. The picnic location is the historic Nickels-Sortwell House lawn and garden in Wiscasset Village (in case of rain, location is in the adjacent barn).
