#### A Message from pastor Aram Mitchell

Welcome to the season of Advent! This season in the cycle of the Christian calendar (along with what you might notice is happening in the natural world around you) is traditionally (and naturally) a time of waiting.

As Frederick Buechner puts it, in the midst of the holiday bustle "if you concentrate just for an instant, far off in the deeps of you somewhere you can feel the beating of your heart... you can hear the world itself holding its breath."

That pause, that concentration, that holding of breath with anticipation—that is the season of Advent. And the thing on the other side of our active anticipation is, of course, a birth.

The power of Advent feels especially pronounced for me this season. As many of you have heard, Emma and I are in active anticipation of the coming birth of our first child! I say "active" anticipation because, along with the waiting, of course, there comes also a powerful impulse to actively *prepare*.

New life that arrives on the other side of our waiting does not happen independent from our participation. Every year—as we remember the birth of Jesus—we re-await the arrival of God-with-us. Every time the earth cycles and this season arrives, we are invited to make room for the divine to enter our hearts, visit our homes, fill our communities, and renew our world.

What this might look like for us is an ever and always unfolding mystery. But whatever the form of God's arrival in your life and in our community this season, you can be sure that your patient and active participation in it is vital. Because that is how new birth works.

So, as you move through the rhythms of this season, keep these questions close to heart: What new life, new happenings, new creation, new wonders are you preparing for this Advent? How does God want to show up in you and through you in new ways?



Any leftover pies were then frozen and/or given away to Edgecomb Green, Tuesday Lunch guests and offered as refreshments during the church's weekly coffee hours that follow Sunday worship. These



funds also are offered up for local assistance projects that present themselves during the year, be it for fuel assistance, aid for a family in need, gifts for Edgecomb Green elderly residents, support for the Recovery Center in Newcastle, Habitat for Humanity, to name just a few.
