

Mission Outreach





Fiberoptic Internet is Coming!

Fidium Fiber has run fiberoptic cable down route 27 this month. Their rep reported to municipal officials this week that they expect to hook up new customers within about three months. Those served by the 882 exchange will get service first; the 633 exchange will follow.

Pricing is available on Fidium's website, but Internet service starts at 100/100 Mbps symmetrical service for \$35/month. While there, sign up for initial connection, with no obligation to enroll. Registering means your hookup will happen more quickly.

Community Resilience Partnership

The Town of Edgecomb is excited to announce that we have partnered with the Lincoln County Regional Planning Commission to enroll in the State of Maine Community Resilience Partnership, which will allow the town to be eligible for state grants to address climate action projects. To kick off this project, the Planning Commission has created a survey to help identify the town's climate priorities, concerns, and perspectives! The survey is anonymous and takes 5-10 minutes. Responses are accepted until Sunday, June 8th, 2025.

Edgecomb residents are also invited to a workshop to discuss climate change and share their thoughts on what the town should do to prepare for the future. This workshop will briefly introduce the State of Maine's Community Resilience Partnership, highlight local climate impacts here in Edgecomb, and include a group discussion period for climate priority setting. 
